Birthstone of the Month

Citrine and Topaz are the top two birthstones of October, known in the Zodiac as The Scorpius (The Scorpion). It is thought to get its name from the French word citron; interpreted it means lemon.



Most Citrine observed is pale yellow in color but seen also in an orange brownish color. The latter color being the most prized color. The presence of iron makes for a darker yellow, which makes for a higher grade of Citrine. It's chemical composition is SiO_2 with Iron Impurities (Fe^{3+}) and a hardness of 7. Most all heat-treated material has a red tint, but natural citrine doesn't. There have been deposits of amethyst found where naturally high temperatures changed it to orange-brown. It is advisable to keep your citrine in a cooler location and way from direct sunlight and heat sources. Also remember that the Citrine is easily marred so be protective of it when you are wearing it.



Citrine has been traced back as far as the end of the 4th century, with a long history as a protective talisman when being worn and used for medical purposes. It has been said to stimulate memory, aid in digestion and possibly be a good healing stone for the heart, liver, and kidney. Also wearing the Citrine may bring about joy, happiness, and be a tranquil effect over the body, as well as helping one to be creative.



Citrine may be found in several US states; Colorado, N. Carolina, Nevada, Georgia and California, as well as in Brazil, Spain, Scotland, and several other countries; while Brazil is the greatest exported of Citrine.



Topaz:

It is believed the word Topaz is derived from Topazos, a small island in the Red Sea, where the Romans obtained a stone which they called by this name. Yet another tale is the name topaz derives from the Greek word meaning "to shine" and also implies "fire". Orange-red "Imperial" topaz and pink colors are rare and most valuable. A mineral occurring in rhombic prisms, a yellow hue and pellucid, and can be colorless, a green hue, blue tones, or even brown shades. It sometimes occurs massive and opaque. The crystal structure of the Topaz (aluminum fluor-silicate), the November birthstone, is orthorhombic.

Just to ponder:

1. The most famous topaz is found in the Portuguese crown. Weighing 1680 carats, this topaz was long thought to be a diamond because of its beautiful cut and clarity.
2. The largest [smokey topaz](#) is on display at The Smithsonian. It is cut and weighs almost 23,000 carats!
3. Because of its golden color, topaz was associated with the sun gods Ra and Jupiter of ancient Egypt and Roman mythology.

The gemstone Topaz can be found in the following countries; Brazil, Nigeria, Sri Lanke, Pakistan and China, Afghanistan and Japan as well as the U.S., Australia and Mexico.

The following is an excerpt in part, from the AFMS Newsletter. It is of great concern to each rockhound, nature lover and recreational enthusiast to take notice of what Dick Pankey relates herein. Mr. Dick Pankey is the President of American Lands Access Association. Following is the excerpt from his attendance of the Listening Session for the AGOI.

Listening Session for the America's Great Outdoors Initiative: July 6

On July 6, 2010 he attended a Listening Session for America's Great Outdoors Initiative held at UC Davis in Davis, CA. He breaks down what he wants to let us know and be alert to, starting with what he sees as said, that we should be concerned about.

The stated reasons for the "Initiative" are to:

- Reconnect Americans, especially children, to the out of doors.
- Build upon State, local, private, and tribal priorities for the conservation
- Use science-based management practices to restore and protect our lands and waters for future generations.

As I understand him; He feels there may be need of New focus in addressing Reason 1. As for Reasons 2 and 3, there are procedures, laws and regulation in place to address them. This "Initiative" is just another way extremist are trying to use to keep people off our public lands and control our use and activities.

We all must get and be and stay involved in the process and participate; as this "Initiative" could affect the use of all public and private lands in the United States. This affects everyone in every state. Watch for the Listening Session for the America's Great Outdoors Initiative: find one in your area and attend it. Here is the statement he gave at the Listening Session for the America's Great Outdoors Initiative held at UC Davis. He states he wants to keep it simple, stating whom he is and to go on record that the Americans Lands Access Assoc. was there and whom they represent, and what they want. The purpose of making this statement at this meeting was to document his presence at the "process". Following is his statement:



"I am Richard Pankey, President of the American Lands Access Association. The purpose of the American Lands Access Association is to promote and ensure the rights of amateur fossil and mineral collecting, recreational prospecting and mining, and the use of public and private lands for educational and recreational purposes; and to carry the voice of all amateur collectors and hobbyists to our elected officials, government regulators and public land managers. We represent the over 52,000 members of 640 societies of the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies and the many, many millions of unaffiliated rockhounds.

We advocate for access to public lands; to keep them open and to reopen unnecessarily closed lands. We promote the principles and policies of Multiple-Use for BLM and FS managed land. We believe that conservation and recreation are compatible and desirable. We need to get past the prejudice that "use is abuse". We believe and advocate that except for special cultural and environmental considerations that all public lands, both Federal and State should be available and useable by our citizens."

The BLM has been hitting us at every opportunity, now this. We as rockhounds need to get involved before we are not allowed field trips to "closed land, or pick up rocks on road side cuts", or just enjoy those exotic hills and lands we have always wanted to venture to but have not gotten to yet. If there is not enough action on our part, contacting our representatives and senators, asking them to vote down any BLM bills to close lands to the everyday hobbyist, there may not be public lands to venture onto. Once the lands are closed, were will you go for a field trip? Please check out these websites; then please get serious, get involved! It is up to you.

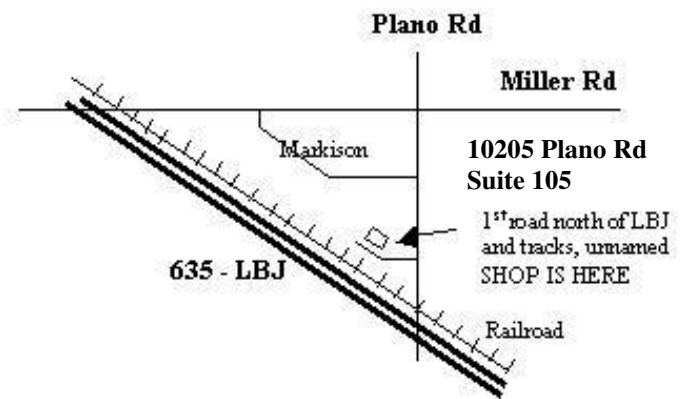
