AFMS Omnibus Land Management Bill

Conservation & Legislation News by John Martin, Chair AFMS Newsletter

By now the 112th Congress has been seated and has been in session for about a month. Even though the 111th Congress failed to pass the second "Omnibus Land Management Act", S.303 "America's Great Outdoors Act of 2010" and as S.2921 "California Desert Protection Act of 2010" died in committee the battle for public land access is not over.

We did not accomplish any "Wins" this year, rather the legislation restricting the use of public lands was put on the back burner only to be reintroduced under a different title or attached to other legislative actions in this new congressional year. The environmental activist lobby has vowed to start their efforts anew with more vigor and determination than was exerted last year.

If the Rockhound Community just sits by as the environmental lobby takes action we will eventually discover that all of our collecting sites have been added to more wilderness and our access roads and trails have been closed to travel except by foot traffic. The restrictive legislation is not only affecting the western states, but it is now being proposed in several legislative acts on the eastern seaboard and some Midwestern states as well. As the new congressional year marches forward the AFMS Conservation and Legislation Committee will be doing their best to keep on top of the issues and trying to keep the Rockhounding Community advised of the changing conditions.

As the new legislation becomes public and our collecting areas become at risk once again, it will take the combined effort of the Rockhounding Community as a whole to make a difference and let our voices be heard in Washington and your state capital. This will be the only way to keep our Public Lands and our collecting areas open to all public users now and for future generations of Rockhounds.

We cannot do it alone, we need your help, so when it becomes time to contact your elected officials please consider taking a little time and send that email, fax or make that phone call. To find your elected legislator and to see what the latest legislative activities are, the American Lands Access Association (ALAA) Website is a good starting point (www.amlands.org).

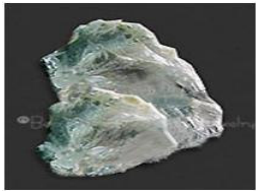

March Birthstone of the Month:

Observing the aquamarine, its color, almost a sea water color, you can see where it gets its Latin name. It is a member of the beryl family, as is the emerald, and has a color range of blue green to faint light blue. Being so pale of color the



expectations for its clarity is high. It is very rare to see a darker aqua than the Swiss Blue Topaz; then is most carefully cut to enhance color and beauty. Color ranges of aquamarine lies in the trace amounts of iron impurities in the beryl structure, are dependent upon the concentrations of Fe²⁺ to Fe³⁺ within the beryl crystal, and where the iron impurities are located. Inclusions which beryl's, particularly



aquamarine have, offer very interesting features: distinctive long, hollow tubes help quickly identify it as a member of the beryl family. When enough of them appear in a stone, the "cut" can produce cat's eyes or stars. Aquamarines is 7.5 the Mohs scale of hardness.

Some of the folklore of this beautiful stone help get them through the worst of storms; soothing influence on relationships; also to or make one youthful. As for its healing and thrust out anger and negativity, then mental balance; to aid in meditation, and are mined in a number of exotic places including Nigeria, Madagascar, Zambia, Pakistan and Mozambique, but most of the gemstones available today come from Brazil.

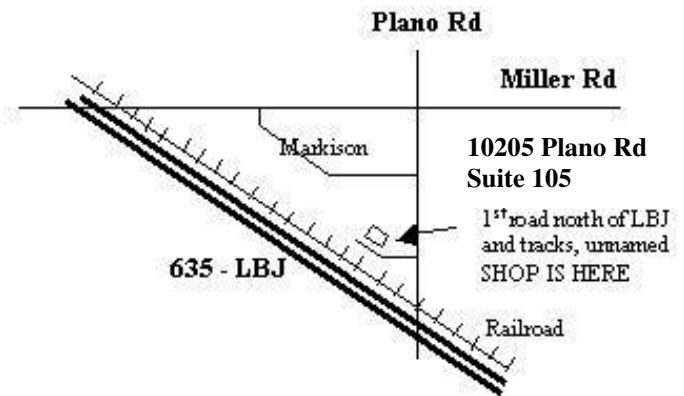
